From Surgery to Sculpture: The Art of Joel Ernster

Retired ENT surgeon and longtime Kissing Camels resident, Joel Ernster, has traded scalpels for sculpting tools—bringing movement, faith, and playfulness to life in bronze.

rom the precision of the operating room to the creativity of the sculptor's studio, Kissing Camels resident Dr. Joel Ernster has carved out a fascinating second career. A retired ear, nose, and throat surgeon, Joel has spent the past several years growing his passion for figurative bronze sculpture—transforming ideas, memories, and moments into lasting works of art.

"I've always been drawn to the human form and to the way movement and emotion can be captured in bronze," Joel explains. Inspired by the great French sculptor Rodin, his work blends classical technique with a playful, sometimes dramatic edge.

Sculptures with Stories

Each of Joel's pieces tells a story—some personal, others spiritual, all deeply human.

· Pickleball Players

As a devoted pickleball player himself, Joel recently completed two sculptures capturing the grace, power, and joy of the game. "They're a little overthe-top," he laughs. "More muscular and dramatic than most players but that's what makes them fun!"

Pirate

A tribute to St. Mary's High School, where both Joel and his sons attended. The pirate mascot, immortalized in bronze, represents family pride and legacy.


· Saul on the Road to Damascus A powerful religious piece depicting Saul's dramatic conversion to Paul. "It's such a strong metaphor for midlife crises or life-changing events," Joel shares. "Being shocked into seeing the world in a new way."
